### MEET JOEY'S BIG BROTHER

Kevin Drwal, Joey Drwal's big brother, is very involved in Down syndrome awareness.

Kevin serves on the Special Olympics Youth Advisory Board. This group is involved in Special Olympics PR, meets quarterly, participates in monthly conference calls, and volunteers at the National Games.

Kevin and his friend Rodney Hannor organized the Spread the Word to End the Word campaign at Millard West High School. They hung a banner in the commons for students to sign and presented a news report on how the "r-word" affects people everywhere. The report was broadcast through the video feed that is shown in homerooms.

Kevin and Brent Holst organized a "Kick it up for Down syndrome" project for Delta Epsilon Chi (High School Division). DECA members sold tickets at school and at all home football games for a chance to kick a field goal from the 30-yard line. Tickets sold for \$3 for one and \$5 for two. This project generated \$200, which was donated to the National Down Syndrome Society.

Another fundraiser was a Mr. Goodcents night that Kevin and Brent promoted at Millard West. Mr. Goodcents donated 10% of their total profits from 4pm to 8pm from one night in October. Millard West collected \$80 on this event to donate to NDSS.

Kevin and Brent presented the information for these projects (including the R-word campaign) at the State DECA meeting in Lincoln.

You may recognize the Millard West Football Team from ODSPN Buddy Walks. The Drwal family has organized the team's involvement in the event for the last four years.

We have successfully incorporated several suggestions from last year's survey, from fresh approaches to welcoming new parents to bringing in the Lose the Training Wheels Camp.


### Buddy Walk 2010

## Letter from Mary McHale

Spring has finally come after an extremely long winter for everyone. Like everyone else, I am thankful that we can go outside and play, ride bikes, do some gardening, attend a soccer game—and other outdoor activities.

Read a post on someone's Facebook page last week that was a celebration of her son's birthday. In thinking of the difference that Daniel has made in my life (especially since Mother's Day is coming up), a few things came to my mind. He has made me:

- An advocate for him until he is able to advocate for himself
- Hopeful for the future for him and others with disabilities
- Strong in our determination for him to have a happy and productive life
- Nervous about the next stages in his life, which includes Middle School and puberty
- More aware of the value of all individuals with disabilities
- Realize that everything we do doesn't have to be therapy for him—sometimes he can just be a child and I can just be a parent
- Proud of what he has accomplished. I have always said that if there was credit given for effort, he would always get the highest grade
- Realize, like any other parent, that your child grows up way too fast and I need to take the time to enjoy the stage that he is at—and not think too hard about what is ahead for him
- Let others know that my son is more like a typically developing child than not and that people can parent a child with a disability—and I am not a special person, but just a Mom trying to do the best I can for my child—just like any other Mom

Parenthood changes a person in so many ways, that it is difficult for me to know if I am changed because of becoming a parent or I am changed because I am the parent of a child with a disability. I imagine that it is a combination of both.

I do know that Daniel has taken us on a journey that I didn't know I would be taking when he was born on May 11, 1998. I have met many different people from many walks of life and I know that my life has been enriched because of this.
